PSC Warns Public About H & W Tour, Inc. *Bus Company Shut Down by Feds on June 30, 2011*

ATLANTA, June 30, 2011 – The Georgia Public Service Commission today noted that the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration today issued a cease and desist order to H & W Tour Inc. of Doraville, Georgia, after finding the company posed an imminent hazard to public safety.

The federal cease and desist order was issued following a compliance review by Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) inspectors that found that H & W Tour, Inc., continued transportation of passengers without federal operating authority and without the required level of insurance. According to the FMCSA, the company: 1. failed to conduct pre-employment drug tests on its drivers and failed to institute a random drug and alcohol testing program as required by federal regulations; 2. failed to ensure that its drivers comply with hours-of-service requirements, records of duty requirements and driver qualification requirements and; 3. buses were not properly inspected, maintained or repaired by the company as required by federal regulations.

The FMCSA Imminent Hazard Out-of-Service order stated, "Individually and cumulatively, these violations and conditions of operation substantially increase the likelihood of serious injury or death to H & W Tour drivers, passengers and the motoring public." The order directs H & W Tour, Inc. buses currently on the road to "proceed to their next immediate destination where the passengers can be safely accommodated."

The FMSCA order will prohibit H & W Tour, Inc. from engaging in intrastate transportation.

The Commission is placing a warning on the Commission website, www.psc.state.ga.us, about H & W Tours, Inc. to prevent any confusion about the company's status.

The Company currently has a permanent certificate of authority to operate within Georgia. Under current Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §§ 46-7-2, 46-7-3, 46-7-85.3, 46-7-85.4 and 46-7-12) all passenger carrier companies that fall under the Commission's authority and operate within the state are required to be registered and have proof of insurance on file with the Commission.
